SERVICES OFFERED

Cardiac diagnostic testing, cardiothoracic surgery, non-invasive cardiac laboratory, cardiac rehabilitation, radiation oncology, PET (Positron Emission Tomography), diagnostic imaging, mammography, radiology, nuclear medicine, emergency services, maternal and child care, neonatology, neonatal intensive care unit, neurology, nutrition counseling, diabetes management, distinct-part/skilled nursing, hyperbaric oxygen therapy, spiritual care, pulmonary function laboratory, pulmonary rehabilitation, radiation and chemo therapies, outpatient surgery, lithotripsy, rehabilitation services including physical, speech and occupational therapies, social services and community education.

FACTS WORTH NOTING

Heart Center — Integrating clinical research with innovative and advance diagnosis, St. Joseph's Heart Center is participating in pioneer studies both nationally and internationally to advance the treatment of cardiovascular disease. Clinical Research Trials have included testing for new drugs, devices and treatment strategies.

Cancer Experts — St. Joseph's Regional Cancer Center (SJRCC) is the only cancer center in San Joaquin County to be Approved by the Commission on Cancer of the American College of Surgeons. SJRCC is staffed by Board Certified Radiation Oncologists and houses two linear accelerators offering the highest quality radiation therapy available in the area. Each year, SJRCC delivers more than 11,300 treatments to cancer patients. Cancer services include Intensity Modulated Radiation Therapy (IMRT), Mammosite, High Dose Rate Brachytherapy, 3-D Conformal Radiation Therapy, Dedicated Inpatient Oncology, Clinical Trials, I.V. Chemotherapy, a Cancer Resource Center, Cancer Navigator, and a full spectrum of patient and family support services.

Emergency Services — Serving the community, St. Joseph's Emergency Department cared for more than 43,900 patient visits last year. Our 23-bed Emergency Department continues to be one of the busiest acute trauma centers in the county. In addition to Emergency, St. Joseph's Immediate Care Clinic cared for more than 28,800 patients last year.

Family Centered Care — which promotes and strengthens family relations with premature infants, is part of our expanded 14-bed Neonatal Intensive Care Unit.

Quality — St. Joseph's Medical Center has consistently been chosen as the Consumer's Choice "Most Preferred Hospital" in studies by the National Research Corporation. The hospital has also been honored as a Top 100 Hospital for Cardiac Services.
